

About Your New Associate Pastor

Rev. Matthew Fenn grew up in Windsor, Ontario, directly south of Detroit. As a teenager, he joined the Jehovah's Witnesses and was deeply involved in that religion for many years. However, his Christian friends challenged him to take a closer look at the Bible and its central message concerning the person and work of Jesus Christ. In 2006, Matthew's life took a profound turn when he became a Christian after reading Philippians 3. His newfound faith led him to explore different Evangelical churches for a time. Still, his convictions about Christ and his free forgiveness of sinners made it clear that some aspects of Evangelical Christianity were lacking. Ultimately, Pastor Matthew found his spiritual home in the Lutheran Church, which he is convinced offers the most authentic expression of Biblical Christianity. He has learned through his experiences the importance of keeping the Scriptures central to our faith. By prioritizing Christ and his Word, all other aspects of life will fall into their proper place.



In 2012, First Lutheran Church in Windsor, Ontario, welcomed Matthew to the Lutheran Church. Not long after his reception, the pastor encouraged Matthew to consider pursuing Holy Ministry. He embraced this encouragement and enrolled at Concordia Lutheran Theological Seminary (CLTS) in St. Catharines, Ontario. Matthew's passion for Christ and his Gospel drew him to the ministry. He has since devoted his life to helping others appreciate the life-giving message of forgiveness. Matthew completed a vicarage in the dual parish at Dryden and Vermillion Bay in northwestern Ontario, two hours north of International Falls, MN, as part of his seminary training. Matthew holds a Bachelor of Divinity (B.D.) from the University of London and a Diploma in Lutheran Theology with Certification for Ordination from CLTS.

On May 25th, 2019, Pastor Matthew received a call to serve as pastor of St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Stratford, Ontario. He was ordained into

the Office of the Holy Ministry on Pentecost, 2019. Just eight months into his tenure, COVID-19 brought some of the strictest lockdowns in North America, challenging Pastor Matthew and his congregation in new ways. Despite these challenges, he served God's people at St. Peter's for four years. Recently, he accepted a call to serve as associate pastor at Ascension. Pastor Matthew is always eager to share the good news of Christ with others. He is happy to engage in conversations about the great things God has done for all humanity through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Reverend Fenn and his wife have happily been married since 2015. Laurin was raised in a non-denominational Christian home in Portland, OR. She was homeschooled through high school. After high school, she attended Concordia University, Portland to study Nursing. During her last year at Concordia Portland, Laurin became sick with Crohn's disease and had to put her Nursing studies on hold. This allowed her to finish her religion minor. The study of theology and the Lutheran Confessions led her to become a Lutheran. Laurin graduated with honors and holds a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and a double minor in Theology and Classical Languages.

While working two years as an RN in home health, a friend of Laurin's who had decided to attend CLTS introduced her to Matthew. They married after a long-distance relationship, and she decided to attend CLTS with Matthew. Laurin graduated from CLTS with a Master of Theology degree. Pastor Matthew and Laurin have been blessed by a gracious God with four energetic children, three boys and a girl, who bring them joy and keep them busy. Laurin finds fulfillment in her role as a stay-at-home mom, dedicating her time and energy to raising and teaching their children. Their shared commitment to family and faith is a cornerstone of their lives, and they are grateful for the many blessings that they have received as a family. When they have free time, the Fenns enjoy pursuing their shared interests. They are avid readers, including genres like fantasy and historical fiction, theology, and philosophy. The boys enjoy playing tabletop games with their daddy. The entire family enjoys spending time together outdoors and on hikes.


