

# **Read God's Word!**

"My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you, listening closely to wisdom and directing your heart to understanding; furthermore, if you call out to insight and lift your voice to understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it like hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and discover the knowledge of God." (Proverbs 2:1–5, CSB)

When the American Bible Society's annual State of the Bible report saw their survey statistics, they found it hard to believe the results. The data said that in 2021 roughly 26 million people had or completely stopped reading the Bible. That's a drastic and discouraging number. The report highlighted the connection between infrequent church attendance and a decrease in Bible reading.

Hosea 4:6 (CSB) says, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I will reject you from serving as my priest. Since you have forgotten the law of your God, I will also forget your sons." The Lord held the Israelites responsible for their lack of knowledge of His Word. The principle is still the same today: without knowledge, especially of God's Word, we will never grow into all God wants us to be!

We should read the Bible because it is God's Word to us. The Bible is literally "God-breathed" (2 Timothy 3:16, ESV). It is God's very words to us. There are so many questions that philosophers have asked that God answers for us in Scripture. What is the purpose of life? Where did I come from? Is there life after death? How do I get to heaven? Why is the world full of evil, and why do I struggle to do good? In addition to these "big" questions, the Bible gives much practical advice. What do I look for in a spouse, and how can I have a successful marriage? How can I be a good friend? How can I be a good parent? If we want to live life as God intended, we must listen to and heed God's written Word. That means knowing what it says.

We can neither fear God nor love him if we do not know him. Reading the Bible helps us understand God's personality and appreciate the wisdom of following his direction. Many of us who have been brought up in church from an early age remember some of the great stories of the Bible. They were told in such a way that they have become etched upon our souls as they declare the mercy and compassion of the Creator God. The stories such as David and Goliath, Samson, Daniel in the Lion's Den, Moses and the Children of Israel, Jesus healing the sick, and so on came alive as our teachers shared from the Word of God. The stories are not only fascinating to hear, but the truths contained in the stories truly can last a lifetime (and eternity!). The Bible is God's Story, which reveals to us who God is and what He has done in Christ. In fact, all of Scripture is about Jesus and what he has done for us (Luke 24:44-49).

I've often heard the silly excuse that people don't like reading the Bible because they don't see how it applies to their daily lives. However, if we are going to use what the Scriptures say in our lives, then we need to know what they actually say. We can't bring what the Bible says into the 21st century without knowing what the Bible is about and what the text says. That means we actually have to read it. The motivation behind reading the Bible should stem from a genuine desire for God and His Word.

This means we may have to make it a habit each day to read God's Word. Finding a specific time in our daily routine is vital. Without deliberately incorporating it, reading the Bible tends to be neglected. Linking it to a regular, concrete part of our schedule, such as waking up in the morning or eating dinner, ensures that it becomes an integral part of our daily lives. Experiment with what works best for you. This might vary depending on the season of life. For instance, waking up early before breakfast may not work for you. In such cases, choosing the time slot after dinner might work better. Don't like reading? There are numerous audio bibles available for you to listen to as you exercise, commute, or do chores.

There will be days when the desire to read may be lacking. When you don't feel like reading, it is crucial to continue reading, trusting that God knows what's best for you. Even when the desire is present, the demands of the world, temptations from the devil, or our own sinful nature can try to distract us. Maintaining our habit of Bible reading will often require practical strategies and adaptation according to different seasons of life. So, it is necessary to approach Bible reading with a measure of common sense.

Jesus thought that God's Word was necessary when he said, "Man must not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4, CSB). We certainly need to eat food and drink water on a daily basis. But even more, we need a regular daily diet of God's Spirit-breathed word. God has given us a powerful and wonderful gift in His Word. By reading it, we're not only spiritually educated but also spiritually fed. If you prioritize Bible reading and incorporate it into your daily routine, you create space for spiritual growth and a closer relationship with God.

*Coffee Outreach*: We will also offer coffee to any staff or teachers who are there as well as any other people we might encounter. Who will God put in our path?


